Jason Gillman – (The Arbiter) Jason is a veteran of seven Broadway shows most recently seen in the original Broadway company of Legally Blonde The Musical. His other Broadway credits include Chicago, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Never Gonna Dance, Annie Get Your Gun and Hello Dolly with Carol Channing. He has performed nationally and internationally with several Broadway tours, traveling all the way to Tokyo, Japan with Chicago The Musical. Jason has appeared at countless regional theatres around the country including The Fifth Avenue Theatre in Seattle, Walnut Street Theatre (Philadelphia), Coconut Grove Playhouse (Miami), Art Park (Buffalo), Pittsburgh Civic Light Opera, and The Berkshire Theatre Festival in Massachusetts. Jason has also done extensive commercial and television work including appearances on "Law & Order", "The Rosie O'Donnell Show", "The Dana Carvey Show", "The Today Show", and "The Kennedy Center Honors". Justin Matthew Sargent – (Freddie Trumper) most recently appeared in Broadway's *Spiderman, Turn off the Dark. He was a* swing in *Rock of Ages* and *Bonnie and Clyde* afte appearing in regional productions of *Pippin, Jesus Christ Superstar* and *High School Musical*. In 2012, Sargent assumed the role of Drew Boley in *Rock of Ages*.

Jennifer Werner Cannizzaro (Director/Choreographer) is currently the Associate Director of the *Book of Mormon* on Broadway. Also Associate Director: *Book of Mormon* National Tours and London *Follies* (City Center/Encores!); *Winnie the Pooh* (Internationa Tour). Jennifer's diverse body of work as a choreographer includes *The Black Suits* (CTG); ABC's *Ugly Betty*; NFL National commercials; *As Long As We Both Shall Laugh* (Roundabout); *My Fair Lady* (Ogunquit Playhouse—IRNE Nomination); *Phantom* (NC Theatre); *A Wonderful Life* (Engeman) and numerous Regional productions of *Cabaret*. Off-Broadway projects with writer Joe Iconis include: *Bloodsong of Love* (Ars Nova), *The Plant That Ate Dirty Socks* (Lucille Lortel Theatre), *ReWrite* (Urban Stages), *Things to Ruin* (Second Stage)--and *The Black Suits* (The Public Theatre/SPF).

Joshua Stephen Kartes (Musical Director) is a freelance composer, arranger, pianist, vocalist, musical director, vocal coach, and clinician currently based in New York City. Joshua is the music director, arranger, and orchestrator for the critically acclaimed **Broadway Sings** concert series at Le Poisson Rouge (performances have also been presented at **54 Below** and **Highline Ballroom**). He is the music director and pianist for Broadway Sessions at the Laurie Beechman Theatre. Prior to his move to the East Coas Joshua spent four and a half years in Chicago, Illinois where he quickly made a name for himself in the theatre and music arenas. On April 29, 2009, Joshua received his third and fourth Joseph Jefferson Non-Equity Award nominations for his work in Theo Ubique Theatre Company's Chicago world premiere hit production of Jacques Brel's Lonesome Losers of the Night (on September 25, 2008, he was announced as the recipient of the 200 **After Dark Award for Outstanding Musical Direction** for his work on this show). Joshua co-created, music directed and wrote the musical arrangements for the show; his nominations are for Outstanding Achievement as Musical Director and for Best New Stag Adaptation. In 2008, Joshua won the Jeff Award for Outstanding Achievement as Musical Director for Theo Ubique's production of the Kander & Ebb musical Cabaret.

Kellyn Uhl (Dance Supervisor) MSU Instructor of Musical Theatre and Dance. She has performed at some of the country's most prestigious regional theaters and collaborated with some of Broadway's most supreme directors and choreographers, including Barrington Stage Company (dir: John Rando, chor: Josh Bergasse), and the Tony Award winning Goodspeed Opera House (dir: Greg Ganakas, chor: Vince Pesce) where she was invited back to serve as assistant director and assistant choreographer during multiple productions (dir: Ray Roderick, chor: Kelli Barclay). In New York, Kellyn has performed at the Hangar Theatre, the Players Theatre, Theatre Under St. Marks, and Dixon Place. Last winter, Kellyn reveled in a three month dance teaching residency at the Rising Star School for leprosy affected youth in Tamil Nadu, India; here she also taught movement therapy classes to neighboring leprosy patients while coaching and choreographing for the first ever dance company comprised of young artists from leprosy colonies: Promethean Spark International's Lifedance Troupe. Currently, she is the resident event photographer at YoutubeSpace New York and has her own successful photography business specializing in actor headshots. Kellyn is a MSU BFA Acting alum and has been joyfully blooming in NYC since graduation in 2010.

Kris Koop Ouellette (**Student Music Supervisor**) Broadway Credits include The Phantor of the Opera on Broadway for 13 years and Cats on Broadway for 3 years. Kris is now the Associate Director of the Institute for Arts & Creativity at the Wharton Center for Performing Arts. She is also an adjunct voice instructor for MSU Department of Theatre.
